TYBA – FIELD VISIT- February 2024

Mahatma Phule Wada and Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Museum

The students of TYBA visited the Mahatma Phule Wada and the Dr. Ambedkar Museums in Pune on 21st and 28th February 2024. This visit was planned in accordance with the teaching-learning of the Semester 6 syllabus of TYBA students. The purpose of the trip was to provide students with a firsthand understanding of the socio-political ideologies and contributions of Mahatma Phule and Dr. B.R. Ambedkar, two seminal figures in India's history.

Mahatma Phule Wada Visit:Our journey commenced at Mahatma Phule Wada, the ancestral residence of Jyotirao Phule. The wada stands as a symbol of Phule's relentless efforts to combat caste-based discrimination and promote social reform and education, particularly for women. During our visit, students had the opportunity to explore the historical significance of Mahatma Phule's work through guided tours and interactive exhibits. They gained insights into Phule's pioneering initiatives, such as the establishment of the Satyashodhak Samaj and his influential writings advocating for social equality.

Ambedkar Museum:Following our visit to Mahatma Phule Wada, we proceeded to the Ambedkar Museum, dedicated to the life and legacy of Dr. B.R. Ambedkar. The museum showcased a wealth of artifacts, documents, and multimedia displays chronicling Ambedkar's journey from his early struggles against caste discrimination to his instrumental role in drafting the Indian Constitution. Students engaged with the museum's exhibits, including replicas of significant documents and audio-visual presentations highlighting Ambedkar's vision of social justice and his contributions to nation-building.

The field trip to Mahatma Phule Wada and Ambedkar Museum proved to be an enriching educational experience for the students. It not only deepened their understanding of the socio-political contexts of colonial India but also encouraged critical reflection on the enduring legacies of Mahatma Phule and Dr. B.R. Ambedkar in contemporary Indian society.

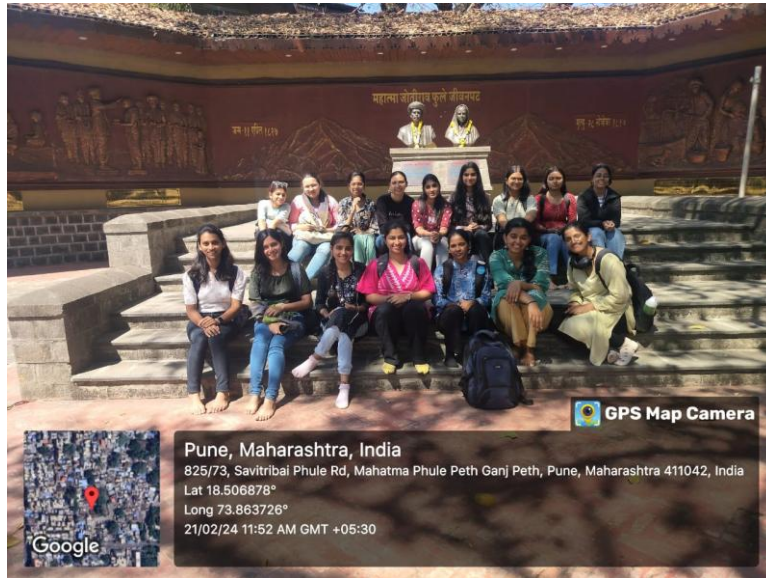
